From the Desk of Pastor Bill

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last month, I wrote about one of several issues I noticed that needed attention at ALC. I had heard a lot of different complaints, not about the Communications Team, but about how communication in general wasn't working very well within the congregation. Members weren't getting different kinds of information to the people or places that needed it in order to keep the members aware of what was going on and when it was happening and who was involved.

I explained how communication was something that the entire congregation was responsible for. I thought I would get all kinds of complaints because I was describing something that needed to be fixed at ALC in order for the congregation to take some steps toward healing.

I was surprised that I didn't get any complaints at all! Instead, I received a bunch of compliments! That was quite pleasant to hear. It was also good to hear that a lot of ALC members were aware of this need for change. Well, maybe you need to hear some good news, too. A couple of the church office workers mentioned that, while it's not been perfect, they've definitely experienced some improvements in our communications with them.

You, too, deserve a word of thanks. Thank you for taking the responsibility and helping improve the communications between us all. God's peace be with you.

Plants are \$12 each, or 3 for \$30. All proceeds will go to support Mission Projects; your purchase also helps support a local family business.




Coming Change to Giving in 2023!

Ascension is blessed so have so many faithful and generous givers! We appreciate you and give thanks to God for your consistent support of our mission!

Our regular offerings to the church are given in different ways. Some of us, myself included, continue to use the pre-printed offering envelopes we purchase each year. After cleaning up the list of those who wanted to continue using envelopes in 2022, we ordered a total of 91 boxes. To date, only 59 people have used their envelopes. The cost for ordering, processing, and mailing out envelopes to those who don't pick them up in church is \$1,000.00. In addition to the cost, many hours are spent in processing and mailing, not to mention the waste of all the unused boxes of envelopes.

As chair of your Stewardship committee, I proposed to the Leadership Council that we discontinue use of pre-printed offering envelopes. In their place we will prepare offering envelopes that will be available in the sanctuary on Sundays and that can be mailed to folks who want them sent to their homes. We will ask you to continue writing your envelope number in the memo line if you are writing a check, or on the outside of the envelope if you are giving cash.



I encourage you to use your envelopes through December of 2022. Thank you for supporting and making arrangements for this time- and money-saving change for our church! We request that disciples not discard their unused offering envelopes. Your unused offering envelopes can be used sometime in the future. Please feel free to cross out old dates and write in new ones,
